#### Discuss

##### Before Viewing

- Visit the Carnegie Center in downtown New Albany to see our permanent exhibition, [Ordinary People, Extraordinary Courage: The Men and Women of the Underground Railroad](#) and view our award-winning documentary on the subject.
- If you're with a school or non-profit, you can sign up your group of 3rd- 5th graders for a live virtual storytelling session about local Civil War nurse Lucy Higgs Nichols. - Research each of the five Field Trip locations by clicking on the links on the previous pages.

##### During Viewing

- Encourage students to write in a journal or sketchbook to record questions, ideas, or pictures related to the video.
- Take note of the vocabulary words that appear in the video and have students try to solve the crossword puzzle
- Younger kids can play the Map Bingo game by watching the video closely for the map(s) that appear in each of the five locations.

##### After Viewing

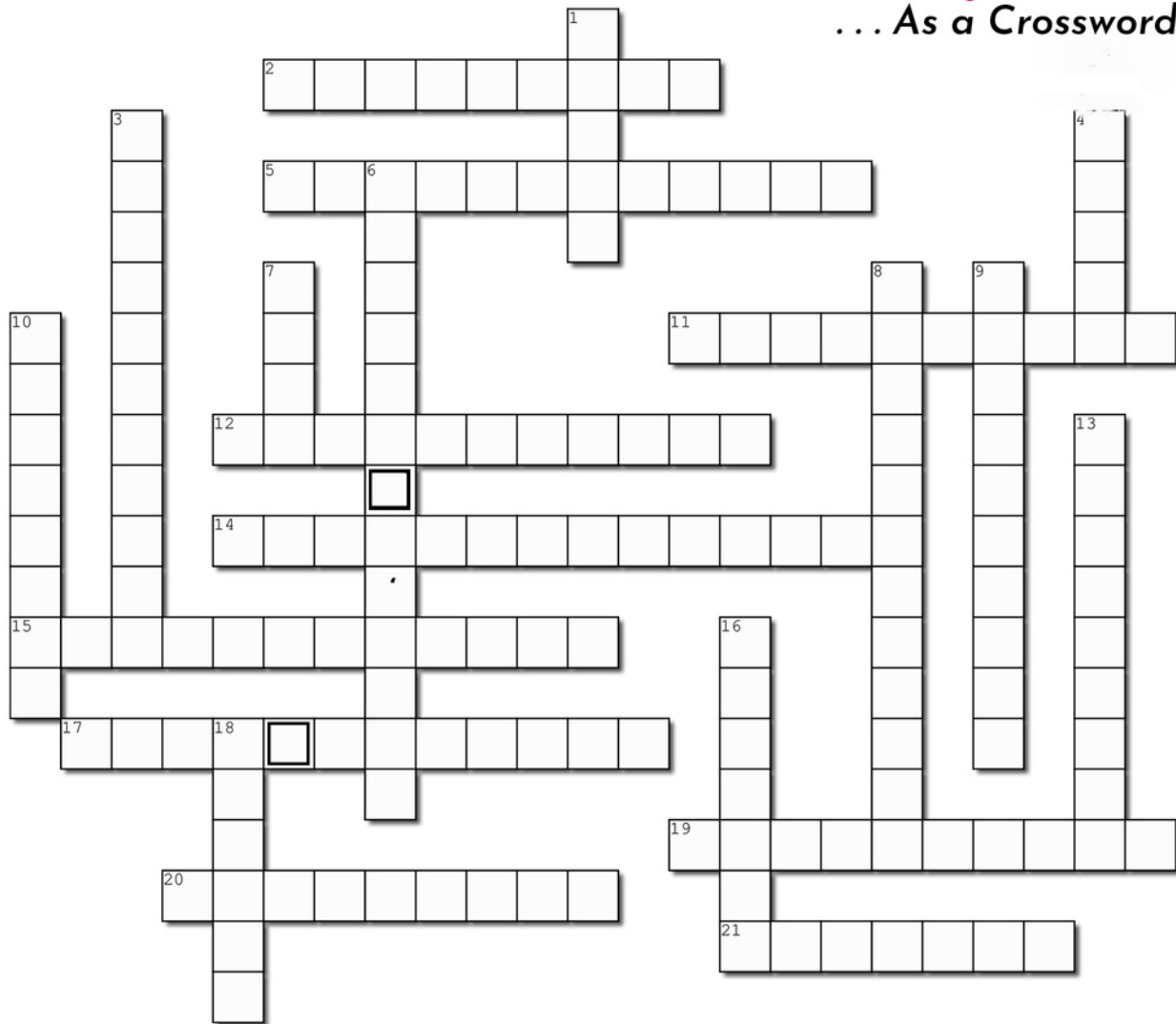
- Q: Why do you think it's important to learn about history? What role does it play in our society?
- Q: What are some local historic sites that did NOT appear in this video that you think should have been highlighted?
- Q: What historic building, old artifact, or true story would you most like to preserve to show or tell to your future grandkids?
- Describe an event or period in history that has been reexamined. How has our understanding of this event or time period changed?

#### Create

- Make a personal map of your life, with five of the most important locations in your life marked with stars. Add texture by glueing down scraps of fabric or paper that are decorative or meaningful to you.
- Bring a sketchbook or a piece of paper outside and sketch a picture of your house. Try drawing the house twice at two different times of day: notice the way that the light and shadow changes the mood.
- Design a work of art that combines art and history in some way. Ideas: paint a scene that depicts a famous moment in history--but with a twist!. Or create a poem, song, or short video inspired by an event in recent history that you believe should be remembered in 20 years.
