# **During Viewing**

- Encourage students to write in a journal or sketchbook to record questions, ideas, or pictures related to the video.
- Take note of the vocabulary words that appear in the video and have students try to <u>solve the crossword puzzle</u>
- Younger kids can play the <u>Map Bingo game</u> by watching the video closely for the map(s) that appear in each of the five locations.

# After Viewing


- Q: Why do you think it's important to learn about history? What role does it play in our society?
- Q: What are some local historic sites that did NOT appear in this video that you think should have been highlighted?
- Q: What historic building, old artifact, or true story would you most like to preserve to show or tell to your future grandkids?
- Describe an event or period in history that has been reexamined. How has our understanding of this event or time period changed?

# <u>Create</u>

- Make a **personal map of your life**, with five of the most important locations in your life marked with stars. Add texture by glueing down scraps of fabric or paper that are decorative or meaningful to you.
- Bring a sketchbook or a piece of paper outside and sketch a picture of your house. Try drawing the house twice at two different times of day: notice the way that the light and shadow changes the mood.
- Design a work of art that combines art and history in some way. Ideas: paint a scene that depicts a famous moment in history--but with a twist!. Or create a poem, song, or short video inspired by an event in recent history that you believe should be remembered in 20 years.



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
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
